TODD DALY TO JOIN FACULTY IN THEOLOGY

Celebrate with us! Urbana Seminary has a theologian! We offered the faculty position in Theology to Todd Daly. At the meeting of June 6 the Board confirmed the offer and on June 8, Todd accepted the job. Todd will arrive to begin teaching Theology 2 and Ethics in the spring semester. Todd is completing his Ph.D. in Theology with an emphasis in Bioethics at the University of Edinburgh in Scotland. He expects to defend his dissertation in the fall. Todd comes to us with a varied set of experiences—for a stretch of his career he worked as an electrical engineer for Motorola—and with a diverse church background, that we believe will help him to connect with the wide range of students who attend Urbana Seminary. When he arrives Todd will teach the spectrum of courses in Theology, as well as courses in Ethics and Apologetics. Todd and his wife, Ann, have two small children (Malynn, 2 and Grey, 4 months).
