

"Life Happens!" and You Can Help

Sometimes, Life Happens. Sometimes it happens to all of us, and no one ever expects it. Whether it is unexpected medical bills, the loss of a job, or unplanned demands from providing for a family, unexpected crises happen. In fact, several of our amazing students here at Urbana Seminary have had unexpected things make it difficult, if not impossible, to pay their tuition. We, the faculty and administration, know that each of these is a person with a heart for the Lord and a deep passion for ministry. We are confident that their training will be put to excellent use and that God will make a significant impact through each life, using the things they have learned here. While we are not sharing their names to protect their privacy, we can say that we have solid proof of both their calling and passion--for example, two are involved in planting new churches, and are modeling a willingness to step out in faith, trusting God. But because the unexpected has happened, they are now behind on their tuition bills.

So here is what we are asking: we would love to raise the funds to pay off the back tuition for these students. We would especially love to have this taken care of by early December, so that those students won't have to worry about tuition as well as everything else during the Christmas season, and can instead focus on God and the gifts he has given us through his Son, Jesus Christ. So between now and December 2 (Giving Tuesday), we are asking you to pray and consider making a one-time gift to the Seminary's "Life Happens" fund. We will use these gifts towards the tuition bills of a handful of students who have been screened by the faculty and administration, who can see that beyond question there is a valid need in each case. Fourth Annual Tolkien Conference

On September 19, Tolkien fans and scholars gathered at Hessel Park Christian Reformed Church in Champaign, IL for our fourth annual Tolkien conference. Guests travelled from as far away as Michigan to hear an excellent lineup. This year's keynote speaker was Dr. Charlie Starr, professor of English at Kentucky Christian University and author of several books, including Light: C. S. Lewis's First and Final Story. Dr. Starr spoke on the view of myth shared by C. S. Lewis and J. R. R. Tolkien. Other speakers included Mike Foster, the American representative of the Tolkien Society, who spoke on two of Tolkien's short stories, "Farmer Giles of Ham" and "Smith of Wooton Major," and Dr. Billie Jarvis-Freeman, who spoke on the presentation of art and artists in Tolkien's fiction (hint: if you meet a character who creates art, they are probably a good guy). Rick Williams from University Baptist Housing Ministry shared ideas about goodness that Tolkien presented in his little-known short story Roverrandom. Dr. Melody Green from Urbana Seminary shared about the uses of metaphor in one of Tolkien's best-known poems, "The Riddle of Strider." Those who attended the conference also enjoyed the rare experience of a Hobbit Birthday party thrown by the Wheaton College Tolkien Society. The party included cake, games, songs, and interactive drama.

Spring Semester Preview: Ageless Gospel in an Ever-Changing Culture?

When I began to teach *Ministry and Evangelism in Cultural Context* in 2005, the biggest issues of contention were the Emergent Church and worship wars. There had been a paradigm shift from the age of modernism where the biggest challenge was "secular humanism", to this postmodern age of relativism. Prior to the 1980's peoples' biggest question about Christianity was, "Is it true?" Now however that question is not even on peoples' radar. "How does it make me feel?" is the question that postmoderns resonate with. But even that doesn't approach the cultural confusion with which we must deal today. Spirituality is in, religion is out. Relevance is in, truth (if there is such a thing) is out.

But the culture in which the church finds itself has grown even more confusing. Freedom of religion is losing ground to freedom of sexual expression. Gay marriage is in, traditional marriage is, well, misunderstood at best, even among those who profess it as the only true kind of marriage. Transgenderism poses a more significant problem for the church as it "flies beneath the radar" because it's not seen.

How do committed Christians answer the cries of "irrelevance" and "bigotry" leveled against them? How does the church go about making, nurturing and reproducing disciples in a generation that loathes authority, eschews categories of "in" and "out", and finds "church" to be a place full of intolerance? *Ministry and Evangelism in Cultural Context* is designed to help American Christians think through the mega-changes taking place and find ways in which to use our paradigm to rescue people from the kingdom of darkness and bring them into the kingdom of Light.

Second Annual Spiritual Life Forum for Pastors

For the second year, the Seminary's Provisions for Pastors Initiative sponsored a Fall Spiritual Life Forum to address issues of inner growth and formation for people in ministry. The focus for 2015 was on Family Life in Ministry: Why ministry leaders need the gospel for marriage and parenting. This time we were privileged to have Dr. Bob Smart, pastor of

Christ Church in Normal, IL, guide us in thinking though this arena of life. As a husband, father of five, and a grandfather, Dr. Smart was able to draw on a rich (both enlightening and humorous) set of experiences to encourage each person and couple who were in attendance. The treatment of family life amidst the pressures of ministry began with a consideration of what it means that each of us has been created in the image of God, drawing from the first chapters of Genesis. That image was designed to be glorious, has been ruined by sin, and is accompanied with the promise of redemption in a Savior. To trace this story in each of our lives points us to our sense of calling, which includes our vision and dreams for the future of a marriage, as well as how couples may stand alongside each other in serving Christ. It also bears implications for those who are parents, balancing between communicating responsibility to children and staying actively engaged with their lives as Dad or Mom. The final session of the day centered on gospel issues and applications in family life, which pointed us to how to be with God in solitude, and



be freed from self-protection and the demands we make on others that are obstacles to truly and deeply loving another. This paved the way to practical help for resolving conflict and increasing sexual intimacy within a marriage. The day was practical and Biblically challenging. The benefits accrued as we traced through the idea of the gospel and how it is lived out and "loved out" in the home.
