May 4 – 16, 2025 Tour Host: Dr. Kenneth Cuffey



May 4 SunDepart from Chicago – Fly to IstanbulMay 5 MonArrive Istanbul AirportPassportcontrol and baggage claim, then look for the "URBANA –TUTKU" sign. Transfer to the hotel for dinner andovernight. (D)

#### May 6 Tue Istanbul Tour – Fly to Antioch (nearest airport)

Explore the wonders of Istanbul. The Golden Mile of the Egnatian Way, Hippodrome Square, and the breathtaking Blue Mosque as well as the magnificent, 1700–year–old Hagia Sophia, a UNESCO World Heritage Site, and historic Hagia Eirene Church. Visit the world-renowned Archaeological Museum home of the Siloam inscription, the Gezer calendar, and the stunning "Jerusalem mosaic." Fly to Antioch (nearest Airport) for overnight. (B,D)

### May 7 Wed Antioch

Visit Antioch, where the followers of Jesus were first called Christians. The Church of St. Peter, a cave church where early Christians met in secret. The Mosaic Museum with its rich collection of mosaics from the area. Seleucia Pieria--the ancient port town of Antioch from which Paul and Barnabas set out on their first journey. Dinner and overnight in Antioch. (B,D)

May 8 ThuAntioch – Tarsus – Konya (Iconium)Early departure from Antioch to drive to Tarsus,<br/>birthplace of the Apostle Paul. Visit the Church of St.<br/>Paul, the recently excavated remains of the Roman



Tarsus in the town center, and the Well of St. Paul. Drive to Derbe where Paul and Barnabas spoke and won many converts. Dinner and overnight at the hotel in Konya, ancient Iconium, also on Paul's 1<sup>st</sup> missionary journey. (B,D)

May 9 FriKonya – Pisidian Antioch – AntalyaDrive to Yalvac, ancient Antioch of Pisidia, site of Paul's 1strecorded Sabbath sermon in the Synagogue. Visit theexcavations here and at the Museum. Continue on abeautiful mountain drive to Antalya. Dinner and overnight athotel in Antalya. (B,D)

### May 10 Sat Antalya (Attalia) – Perga – St. Paul Cultural Center – Boat ride

Visit Perga, through which Paul and Barnabas passed on their way to and from Antioch on the 1st journey. See the Perga Theater, the Agora Stadium, and the columned streets, the Archaeological Museum of Antalya and the Old City. Lunch at St. Paul Cultural Center, then by boat to Magydus. Dinner and overnight in port city of Antalya. (B,D)

May 11 SunLaodicea – Colossae – PamukkaleDrive to Laodicea, one of the Seven Churches of Revelation(3:14-22), a major city in Roman times. See its two theatres,stadium, aqueduct and major street lined with shops. Thendrive to the Roman site of Colossae (Paul to the Colossians &Philemon) on the foothills of Mount Honaz. Dinner andovernight in Pamukkale. (B,D)

May 12 MonHierapolis – Miletus – KuşadasıVisit Hierapolis — the beautifully preserved theater, Temple ofApollo, and Philip's Martyrium. Then to Miletus with fourharbors on the Aegean coast, one of the great ancient citiesof commerce. Visit the 15,000–seat Roman theatre. HerePaul stopped on his 3rd missionary journey to speak with theelders from Ephesus for the final time (Acts 20:17–35). ToKuşadası for dinner and overnight. (B,D)

May 13 Tue Ephesus – Izmir (Smyrna) Visit the most impressive biblical site of our trip: Ephesus. Paul was here in his 2nd & 3rd missionary journeys (Acts 18:18-21; Acts 19). Timothy was a pastor here (1 & 2 Timothy). Ephesus was home base for the apostle John's ministry, thus the setting for 1, 2, 3 John and part of the Book of Revelation. Traditionally Mary the mother of Jesus lived out her later years in the city. The former glory of Ephesus is seen in well-preserved streets, temples, fountains, and public baths. The Temple of Artemis—one of seven wonders of the ancient world. The 24.000-seat theatre was the site of the riot in response to Paul's ministry there. We will see the "terrace houses" (marvelously reconstructed homes of the wealthy), the Ephesus Museum, and the Basilica of St. John. Dinner and overnight in İzmir, a port city known in the ancient world as Smyrna. (B,D)

### May 14 Wed Smyrna - Sardis – Philadelphia – Izmir

Visit the Agora of ancient Smyrna, another of the 7 Churches of Revelation (2:8–11). Drive to Sardis (Rev. 3:1-6) to see the remains of a magnificent temple of Artemis, the beautifully reconstructed gymnasium and public baths, and the largest known synagogue outside Palestine. Our next stop is Philadelphia (Rev. 3:7-13) to see remains of the ancient city within a modern city. Dinner and overnight in Izmir. (B,D)

May 15 ThuPergamum – Thyatira - IzmirTravel north to Pergamum, another amazinglyimpressive archaeological site (Rev. 2:12-17). Itsattractions include the 10,000-seat theatre, thesteepest in the ancient world; the Acropolis; themagnificently restored temple of Trajan; a librarysecond in size only to that in Alexandria; the base ofthe Altar of Zeus; the temple of Dionysus; and themedical center of Asclepius with its own theatre,library, underground tunnel and other buildings.Then, stop briefly in the ancient city of Thyatira (Rev.2:18-29), modern city of Akhisar, to visit the fewarchaeological remains thus far uncovered. Return toour hotel in Izmir for dinner and overnight. (B,D)

May 16 Fri Transfer to Izmir Airport – Fly Back to Chicago.
